RESOLUTION NO. 24-443

A resolution approving the 2024 Balancing Budget Adjustment and 2025 Budget Plan (Operations and Five-Year Capital Outlay) of the Terrebonne Parish Veterans Memorial District.

RESOLUTION NO. 24-444

A RESOLUTION RATIFYING THE EXECUTION ON BEHALF OF TERREBONNE PARISH CONSOLIDATED GOVERNMENT OF THAT CERTAIN STANDARD AGREEMENT BETWEEN OWNER AND CONTRACTOR FOR REPAIRS TO THE WATERLIFE MUSEUM CAUSED BY TERMITE DAMAGE

WHEREAS, by virtue of the authorization under Terrebonne Parish Council Resolution No. 22-197, the Terrebonne Parish Consolidated Government entered into a contract with HMSE, LLC to perform Hurricane Ida related repairs to the Waterlife Museum under FEMA Project No. DI-1234227, Contract No. IDA-0113, filed for record in Terrebonne Parish MOB 1690495; and

WHEREAS, the contract was administered under TPCG's Hurricane Ida Facilities Repair Manager, Royal Engineers and Consultants, LLC, and the work was monitored by Architects Beazley Moliere, APC; and

WHEREAS, while repairing walls on the interior of the building under the said contract, HMSE discovered termite damage in the walls of the building; and

WHEREAS, initial repairs to the termite damage were started using the contingency under the aforesaid contract for FEMA Project No. DI-1234227; and

WHEREAS, in or around September 2024, Contractor discovered that the termite damage in the building was severe, and the repair costs would be significantly more than the contingency under the aforesaid contract; and

WHEREAS, considering the severity of the termite damage and extreme danger to the integrity of the building, Royal Engineering issued another contract, TPCG Contract No. IDA-0126, to HMSE in the amount of \$201,567.00 to begin work immediately on the repairs to the termite damages at the building, which was filed at Terrebonne Parish MOB Entry No. 1697454, a copy of which is attached and incorporated herein; and

WHEREAS, Royal Engineers mistakenly issued the contract to the Parish President for execution with the understanding that the contract was authorized by Council Resolution No. 22-197; and

WHEREAS, in fact, the contract for the termite repairs at the Waterlife Museum requires Council Approval because it is not a FEMA reimbursable cost, is not within the scope of authorization of Resolution No. 22-197, and the contract price exceeds \$60,000; and

WHEREAS, TPCG desires to have the Terrebonne Parish Council ratify the contract between TPCG and HMSE for the repairs to the Waterlife Museum due to termite damage;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Terrebonne Parish Council, on behalf of the Terrebonne Parish Consolidated Government, hereby ratifies the execution by the Parish President of the attached contract between Terrebonne Parish Consolidated Government and HMSE, LLC for the work necessary to repair the termite damage to the Waterlife Museum.

RESOLUTION NO. 24-449

A RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE PARISH PRESIDENT TO EXECUTE A MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING BETWEEN THE TERREBONNE PARISH CONSOLIDATED GOVERNMENT (TPCG) AND THE ST. BERNARD PROJECT, INC. (SBP)

WHEREAS, SBP is a developer of affordable housing in the State of Louisiana; and

WHEREAS, TPCG is the local political subdivision overseeing the Housing & Human Services Department, whose mission is, in part, to provide safe, decent and sanitary housing for low-income persons; and

WHEREAS, TPCG has a current need for affordable housing for low-income residents of Terrebonne Parish; and

WHEREAS, SBP and TPCG hereby agree to work cooperatively to develop a 90-unit, fully affordable housing scattered-site rental development (the "**Project**") to be known as Parkwood Place within the City of Houma, Louisiana, in accordance with the terms of the attached MOU and subject to the terms of any associated local or federal funding; and

WHEREAS, Article VII, Section 14(B) authorizes political subdivisions to use public funds for, among other things, "programs of social welfare for the aid and support of the needy;" and

WHEREAS, pursuant to Louisiana Constitution Art. 7, Section 14, the parties hereto believe that this Memorandum of Understanding justifies the utilization of any public funds necessary to further the long-term goals of the TPCG Housing & Human Services Department; and

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the Terrebonne Parish Consolidated Government hereby authorizes its Parish President to execute any and all documents necessary to effectuate this Memorandum of Understanding in accordance with substantially the same terms as the attached documents.

ORDINANCE NO. 9676

AN ORDINANCE CREATING THE GRAND CAILLOU FIRE PREVENTION BUREAU AS A CERTIFIED FIRE PREVENTION AGENCY AND DEFINING THE INTENT, PURPOSE AND ORGANIZATION OF SAID BUREAU AND PROVIDING FOR RELATED MATTERS.

SECTION 1

WHEREAS, the Terrebonne Parish Council and the Grand Caillou Fire Protection District, in the interest of the health safety and welfare of its citizens, desire to enhance protection of citizens and property from the ravages of fire; and

WHEREAS, the Terrebonne Parish Council, on behalf of the TPCG and the Grand Caillou Fire Protection District, believes it is in the best interest of the citizens in the Grand Caillou Fire Protection District that the District be established as a State Fire Marshal Certified Fire Prevention Bureau to allow local fire prevention service responsibilities to be delegated by the Office of the State Fire Marshal; and

WHEREAS, <u>La.</u> R.S. 40:1578.7,(C) states, where a fire prevention code is adopted by any political subdivision of the state, it must adopt the State Uniform Fire Prevention Code (NFPA 1) as from time to time amended and otherwise enforced by the Office of the State Fire Marshal.

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT ORDAINED, by the Terrebonne Parish Council, on behalf of the Terrebonne Parish Consolidated Government that the Parish Code, Chapter 8 "Fire Protection & Prevention" be and hereby is amended to add a new ARTICLE VII, "Grand Caillou Fire Prevention Bureau" as follows:

TERREBONNE PARISH CODE CHAPTER 8 – FIRE PROTECTION AND PREVENTION ARTICLE VII – GRAND CAILLOU FIRE PREVENTION BUREAU

Section 8-97: Bureau Established

The Grand Caillou Fire Prevention Bureau is hereby established to operate under the control and within the jurisdiction of the Terrebonne Parish Fire Protection District 4A to protect citizens and property through the local provision of guidance and enforcement services set out in state law and delegated to the Bureau, upon certification, by the State Fire Marshal, in which endeavor it shall uphold and administer all relevant and duly adopted laws, codes and regulations of the State of Louisiana and the Parish of Terrebonne.

Section 8-98: Grand Caillou Fire Prevention Bureau

The Grand Caillou Fire Prevention Bureau (hereinafter within Chapter 8, Article VII referred to as the "Bureau") shall be headed by the Terrebonne Parish Fire Protection District 4A Fire Chief (hereinafter, within Chapter 8, Article VII, referred to as the "Fire Chief"). State Fire Marshal-commissioned Fire Inspectors of Terrebonne Parish Fire Protection District 4A (hereinafter after, within Chapter, 8 Article VII, referred to as "Fire Inspector") and Bureau shall have delegated responsibility and authority by the Fire Chief and State Fire Marshall, for proper discharge of the Bureau's functions.

Section 8-99: Duties and Responsibilities

A. The code official responsible for the administration of the codes adopted herein shall be the Fire Chief who shall hold such authority for the jurisdiction.

- B. The Bureau, Fire Chief and Fire Inspectors, acting in accordance with state law and local codes, shall ensure:
 - (1) The prevention of fires through fire and life safety code enforcement;
 - (2) The proper and safe storage and use of explosives and flammables;
 - (3) The safe installation and maintenance of automatic and other fire alarm systems, and fire extinguishing equipment;
 - (4) The provision of proper water supply through the placement and regulation of fire hydrants and fire department connections;
 - (5) The means and adequacy of ingress and egress by fire department personnel, in case of fire or emergency, to and from buildings and all other places in which numbers of persons work, live, or assemble from time to time for any purpose;
 - (6) Investigation of the origin, cause, and circumstances of every fire occurring within the Terrebonne Parish Fire Protection District 4A to determine if the fire was a result of carelessness, design or an intentional act. Any fire that is or could possibly be due to an intentional or malicious act shall be treated as a crime scene and the department retains the authority contained in RS 40:1563.1, to further investigate the circumstances and determine the person or persons responsible. The Sheriff's Office shall, upon request, assist the fire department in the investigation of suspicious fires.
 - (7) The maintenance of fire cause and loss records;
 - (8) Information and outreach education on matters of fire safety to citizens located within its area:
 - (9) Inspect, or cause to be inspected, all structures, except one- and two-family dwellings and movables, for the purpose of reducing or eliminating fire hazards. Such inspection shall not include initial final inspections which shall continue to be handled by the Office of State Fire Marshal.
 - (10) Copies of inspection reports in proper format shall be filed with the State Fire Marshall's office.
 - (11) Continued education as necessary to maintain Bureau standing through a training program recognized by the Office of State Fire Marshal.
 - (12) Perform such other duties set forth in other sections of this Code of Ordinances, and as imposed from time to time by law or by the Louisiana State Fire Marshal acting in the lawful discharge of his office.

Section 8-100: Codes Adopted.

The State Uniform Fire Prevention Code as adopted by LA Revised Statute 40:1578.7 and Louisiana Administrative Code Title 55: V: 103 and the most current edition of the LA State Fire Marshal's Act and the editions of NFPA 1 Fire Code and NFPA 101 Life Safety Code most recently adopted by the Office of the State Fire Marshal, all as may from time to time be amended by the State Legislature, are hereby adopted and incorporated as if set out in their entirety, herein.

Not less than one copy of the most current adopted issue of the Uniform Fire Prevention Code, life safety code, and the adopted standards and codes adopted herein shall be filed in the office of the Bureau and the provisions thereof shall be enforced within the limits of the Bureau.

Section 8-101: - Appeals from decision of the Fire Chief.

Appeals of orders, decisions, or determinations made by the Fire Chief, relative to the application and interpretation of this Article VII, shall be heard by the *Board of Appeals* established in Appendix A, Section 113 of the *Terrebonne Parish Consolidated Building Code*, under the terms and provisions as therein adopted for the hearing of appeals of orders, decisions, or determinations made by the building official.

Section 8-102: Enforcement.

The codes adopted in Article VII, **Section 8-100**, shall be enforced by the Fire Chief.

Section 8-103: Violations, penalties.

The procedure and penalties for violations of this Article VI shall follow the procedures adopted in Appendix A, Section 114 of the *Terrebonne Parish Consolidated Building Code* with "*Code Official*" substituted for the words "*Building Official*" wherever they appear.

Secs. 8-104—8-111. – Reserved.

SECTION II

If any word, clause, phrase, section or other portion of this ordinance shall be declared null, void, invalid, illegal, or unconstitutional, the remaining words, clauses, phrases, sections and other portions of this ordinance shall remain in full force and effect, the provisions of this ordinance hereby being declared to be severable.

SECTION III

This ordinance shall become effective upon approval by the Parish President or as otherwise provided in Section 2-13(b) of the Home Rule Charter for a Consolidated Government for Terrebonne Parish, whichever occurs sooner.

AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND THE PARISH CODE OF TERREBONNE PARISH BY ADDING TO CHAPTER 18: MOTOR VEHICLES AND TRAFFIC, ARTICLE IV:

OPERATION OF VEHICLES, DIVISION 3. - CITY, SECTION 18-119 (A) (5), TO ESTABLISH A "15 MPH SPEED LIMIT" ZONE ALONG THE ENTIRE LENGTH OF CHRISTOPHER DRIVE; TO PROVIDE FOR THE INSTALLATION OF SAID SIGNS; AND TO PROVIDE FOR OTHER MATTERS RELATIVE THERETO.

SECTION I

BE IT ORDAINED, by the Terrebonne Parish Council, in Regular Session convened, acting pursuant to the authority invested in it by the Constitution and laws of the State of Louisiana, the Home Rule Charter for a Consolidated Government for Terrebonne Parish, and including, but not limited to, LSA R.S. 33:1368 and other statutes of the State of Louisiana, to amend the Parish Code of Terrebonne Parish, Chapter 18: Article IV, and appropriate Section to create a "15 mph Speed Limit" zone along the entire length of Christopher Drive.

CHAPTER 18: MOTOR VEHICLES AND TRAFFIC ARTICLE IV: OPERATION OF VEHICLES

DIVISON 3. – CITY:

SECTION 18-119: Speed restrictions.

(a)(5): "The speed limit shall be fifteen (15) miles per hour on the following streets:"

The entire length of Christopher Drive shall be declared as a "15 mph Speed Limit" zone, and appropriate "15 mph Speed Limit" signs shall be erected and maintained along the said section of roadway. Any vehicle traveling on Christopher Drive shall adhere to the provisions of this ordinance.

SECTION II

If any word, clause, phrase, section or other portion of this ordinance shall be declared null, void, invalid, illegal, or unconstitutional, the remaining words, clauses, phrases, sections and other portions of this ordinance shall remain in full force and effect, the provisions of this ordinance hereby being declared to be severable.

An ordinance declaring the following property adjudicated to Terrebonne parish consolidated government as surplus and not needed for a public purpose; <u>103</u> <u>Fishermans In, Parcel No 26832 (12.5%);</u> and to address other matters relative thereto.

SECTION I

Each bid shall be accompanied by a deposit in the form of a Certified Check, Cashier's Check, Money Order or Bid Bond with Power of Attorney (Letters of Credit WILL NOT be accepted) in the amount of twenty percent (20%) of the proposed price made payable to the Terrebonne Parish Consolidated Government. The winning bidder, otherwise known as the Purchaser or Acquirer, of this adjudicated property is solely responsible for compliance with La. R.S. 47:2206 regarding notification of parties who may have had an interest in the property regarding their rights of redemption and La. R.S. 47:2208 regarding recordation of those notices. Copies of the applicable law will be distributed along with bid packets for this adjudicated property. Terrebonne Parish Consolidated Government has not and will not perform these requirements; thus, it is the purchaser's or acquiring person's responsibility to do so. Terrebonne Parish Consolidated Government encourages the Purchaser or Acquiring Person to consult legal counsel regarding Louisiana law on adjudicated property.

SECTION IV
