

SENIOR UTILITY SERVICE WORKER - GAS

SUMMARY

Perform skilled, semi-skilled, and labor-intensive tasks related to the service and operation within the municipal gas distribution system. Perform routine and emergency operational functions. Ensure responsiveness to reports of gas leaks and customer service complaints.

PHYSICAL DEMANDS

- Lift over 50 lbs. (heavy)
- Perform miscellaneous labor-intensive tasks, such as digging, painting, making repairs, etc.

WORK ENVIRONMENT

Outdoors in varying climates and conditions.

ESSENTIAL FUNCTIONS

1. Install/remove meters and service lines.
2. Investigate and respond to gas leak complaints.
3. Institute remedial action to repair meters and service valve/line leaks, and locate leaks for repair crew.
4. Assist repair crew as needed.
5. Exercise high degree of safety awareness.
6. Perform other tasks required by this position as identified in CFR part 192.801.
7. Perform other duties as assigned by supervisor.

GENERAL REQUIREMENTS

1. Thorough knowledge of acceptable safety practices and procedures used in the maintenance and operation of domestic natural gas systems including those used for "hot" repairs.
2. Knowledge of federal, state, and local gas regulations.
3. Ability to use mobile devices and computerized work order systems.
4. Maintain 24-hour telephone service.
5. Ability to interpret blueprints and diagrams.
6. Ability to operate and interpret readings from various instruments, including CGI, line locators, odometers, etc.
7. Ability to become qualified on all tasks within the six-month probationary period of employment. During this time, employee will be allowed two attempts at each task to demonstrate qualification. Second failure will result in termination.

EDUCATION, EXPERIENCE, AND LICENSES

1. High school diploma or GED certificate required.
2. Two years of experience in the operation and maintenance of natural gas systems.
3. Supplemental training relative to gas system safety practices, odorizing, etc.
4. Any equivalent combination of education, training, and/or experience may substitute.
5. Possess and maintain valid Louisiana driver's license. May be required to obtain and maintain Class B commercial driver's license (CDL).

EMERGENCY EVENTS

Required to work during emergency events.
