Terrebonne Parish Information

1) Coast Guard representatives in Cocodrie reported:

- Total personnel in Cocodrie: 769
- National Incident Commander reports that the oil recovery for the last 24 hours is 23,700 barrels.
- Heat continues to be an issue with 100-103 degree heat index.
- Members of the media scheduled to visit Cocodrie today include representatives from The Washington Post.
- In Point Aux Chene, there are 167 personnel and 38 boats.
- Both vacuum barges, known as swabbers, are on site in Terrebonne Parish. One is on standby just north of Pelican Island. The other swabber is on standby north of Timbalier Island.

Boats/Vessels

- Deployment of Skimmers:
 - 7 total:
 - 1 between Wine and Trinity.
 - 2 on station behind Timbalier Bay.
 - 4 in Lake Barre and Terrebonne Bay.
- 96 boats on site assisting with cleanup in Cocodrie.

Boom

- Boom Maintenance continues to make up the majority of the operations being conducted out of Cocodrie.

Cleanup Progress

- Continued beach reconnaissance and manual recovery of discovered oil.
- All recovery operations are to follow the general shoreline treatment recommendations established for Timbalier Bay and Terrebonne Bay.

2) Oil impact reports:

- Assessment team reports the following:
 - No oil was observed on gulf side of Trinity Island.
 - No oil was observed south of Texaco Camps.
 - No oil was observed south of Little Pass.
 - No oil was observed 5 miles southeast of Little Pass.
 - No oil was observed 8 miles southeast of Little Pass.
 - No oil was observed in southwest portion of Lake Barre'.
 - No oil was observed in Cat Island Pass.
- Received a report that subsurface oil sighted near Timbalier Island had been cleaned up well. Assessment team confirmed that no oil has been sighted in the area since then.

British Petroleum Claims Center

BP has opened the following claims centers in Terrebonne to process claims for those who have lost income due to the recent spill in the Gulf of Mexico.

1. **814 Grand Caillou Rd. Suites 2 & 3- Plaza Caillou Shopping Center - (8:00 AM and 7:00 PM, seven days a week).**
2. **5703 Highway 56, Chauvin - (7:00 AM to 7:00 PM, seven days a week).**

Those wishing to seek claims should bring photo identification as well as all necessary documentation to verify income from previous years.

Department of Social Services

A temporary Food Stamp distribution center has been set up at the Chauvin Senior Center to take applications for their regular program. This is **not** emergency food stamps. SBA

The Small Business Administration (SBA) has also opened an office on **the first floor of the Government Tower located at 8026 Main Street**. Their operating hours are 8:00 am to 5:00 pm, Monday thru Friday.

Current Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP) recipients do not need to pre-apply and would receive disaster benefits automatically.
