**Terrebonne Parish Consolidated Government Providing Sand and Sandbags for Residents**

**Houma (March 10, 2016)** – Terrebonne Parish President Gordon Dove has instructed the Parish's Public Works Division to provide sand and sand bags for those residents who wish to prepare for the possibility of flooding from the severe weather event that may affect Terrebonne Parish through Saturday with excessive rainfall.

Sand and sand bags will be available to residents for self-filling at the following locations beginning at 1PM today. Residents are encouraged to bring their own shovel to fill the sand bags.

Terrebonne Parish is currently under a Flash Flood Watch until 6PM Saturday and a Coastal Flood Advisory until 6PM tomorrow (Friday) and a Wind Advisory until 6PM this evening. Our area could receive 4 to 7 inches of rainfall with a possibility of up to 13 inches in isolated areas.

Flooding of low-lying areas within the parish will be occurring due to tides ranging from 1.5 to 3 feet above normal.

Residents should continue to monitor weather conditions and be prepared for possible road closures due to coastal flooding and excessive rainfall.

The Terrebonne Parish Office of Homeland Security and Emergency Preparedness along with local law enforcement and other Parish agencies are continuing to monitor this situation and will be meeting this afternoon to discuss possible emergency actions that may be required for this event.
