## What Is the National Utility Phone Scam?



Entergy NEVER demands immediate payment from customers over the phone.

You shouldn't give your personal information to strangers.

Individuals claim to be members of a local utility & threaten to disconnect your electrical services if you don't make an immediate payment on a past due bill.

They then direct the customer to transfer funds electronically. sometimes through money wiring systems or pre-paid cards, such as Green Dot Money Pak cards.

Callers often use sophisticated spoofing technology to replicate the utility's name & number on the customer's caller ID, making it particularly difficult for the customer to spot this scam.


