### **ORDINANCE NO. 9037**

ARTICLE ANORDINANCE TO **AMEND** COMMUNICATIONS TOWERS, OF CHAPTER 6, OF THE TERREBONNE PARISH CODE OF ORDINANCES; TO MOVE AND REDESIGNATE SECTIONS 6-175 THROUGH 6-179 OF THE CODE TO SECTIONS 6-181 THROUGH 6-185; TO ENACT SECTIONS 6-175 THROUGH 6-180 OF THE CODE AND APPENDIX B TO CHAPTER 6 OF THE CODE TO PROVIDE FOR THE REGULATION AND PERMITTING OF THE CONSTRUCTION, INSTALLATION, MODIFICATION AND REMOVAL OF SMALL WIRELESS FACILITIES WITHIN THE RIGHTS OF WAY TERREBONNE PARISH; AND TO ESTABLISH FEES FOR PERMITTING AND ANNUAL RIGHT OF WAY USE FOR SMALL WIRELESS FACILITIES; AND TO PROVIDE FOR RELATED MATTERS.

WHEREAS, Section 1-06 of the Home Rule Charter for the Parish of Terrebonne provides that the parish government shall have the right, power and authority to pass all ordinances requisite or necessary to promote, protect and preserve the general welfare, safety, health, peace and good order of the parish, including, but not by way of limitation, the right, power and authority to pass ordinances on all subject matter necessary, requisite or proper for the management of the parish affairs, and all other subject matter without exception, subject only to the limitations that the same shall not be inconsistent with the Constitution or expressly denied by the general law applicable to the parish; and

WHEREAS, the Terrebonne Parish Consolidated Government ("TPCG") encourages wireless infrastructure investment and wishes to provide a fair and predictable process for the location and modification of telecommunication towers, deployment of small wireless facilities while enabling the TPCG to promote management of the rights-of-way in the overall interests of the public health, safety and welfare and the aesthetics of the parish in the interest of maintaining property values; and,

**WHEREAS**, the TPCG recognizes that small wireless facilities – including facilities commonly referred to as small cell wireless systems – are critical to delivering wireless access to advanced technology, broadband, and 9-1-1 services to residences, businesses, and schools within the parish; and,

WHEREAS, the Terrebonne Parish Consolidated Government desires to enact ordinances to governing the development, implementation and enforcement of regulations and

permitting requirements for the placement, renovation, improvement, modification, demolition, or removal of small cell facilities, and other telecommunications towers within the parish of Terrebonne.

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED** by the Terrebonne Parish Council on behalf of the Terrebonne Parish Consolidated Government that:

#### **SECTION I**

The caption and title of Article VI of Chapter 6 of the Terrebonne Parish Code of Ordinances shall be and is hereby amended, with underlining format showing additions, as follows:

## ARTICLE VI. - COMMUNICATION TOWERS <u>AND SMALL</u> <u>WIRELESS FACILITIES</u>

#### **SECTION II**

Sections 6-175 through 6-179 of Article VI of Chapter 6 of the Terrebonne Parish Code of Ordinances shall be and are hereby moved and re-designated in their entirety to Sections 6-181 through 6-185.

#### **SECTION III**

Section 6-184 (as re-designated) of Article VI of Chapter 6 of the Terrebonne Parish Code of Ordinances shall be and is hereby amended (underlining indicates additions; strikethrough indicates deletions) as follows:

Section 6-184. - Waiver of Variance for setback requirements.

The setback requirements established by section 6-175 Section 6-181 may be waived by the parish council, via ordinance, in accordance with Section 2-11(17) of the Terrebonne Parish Charter its motion procedure, through the recommendation of the director of the department of planning and zoning. Any such waiver of setback requirements shall be consistent with a waiver form approved by legal counsel for the parish government and the department of planning and zoning. A copy of all such waiver forms shall be maintained be the director of the department of planning and zoning.

#### **SECTION IV**

Sections 6-175 through 6-179 of Article VI of Chapter 6 of the Terrebonne Parish Code of Ordinances shall be and are hereby enacted as follows: Section 6-175 - Purpose and intent.

- (a) The purpose of this Article is to encourage telecommunication and wireless infrastructure investment by providing a fair and predictable process for the deployment of these facilities, while enabling the Parish to promote the management of rights-of-way and visual qualities in the overall interests of the public health, safety, and welfare.
- (b) Intent. In enacting this Article, the Parish is establishing uniform standards to address issues presented by telecommunication towers and small wireless facilities, including without limitation, to:
  - 1. Prevent interference with the use of streets, sidewalks, alleys, parkways and other public ways and places;
  - 2. Prevent the creation of visual and physical obstructions and other conditions that are hazardous to vehicular and pedestrian traffic;
  - 3. Prevent interference with the facilities and operations of facilities lawfully located in rights-of-way or public property, as well as public safety vehicles;

- 4. Protect against environmental damage, including damage to trees;
- 5. Preserve the character of the neighborhoods in which facilities are installed; and
- 6. Facilitate rapid deployment of small cell facilities to provide the benefits of advanced wireless services.
- (c) Conflicts. This Article supersedes all provisions adopted prior hereto that are in conflict herewith, to the extent of such conflict.

Section 6-176 - Definitions.

For the purposes of this Article, the following definitions shall apply:

- (a) "Antenna" means communications equipment that transmits or receives electromagnetic radio frequency signals used in the provision of wireless services.
- (b) "Applicable Codes" means the Terrebonne Parish Code and uniform building, fire, electrical, plumbing, or mechanical codes adopted by a recognized national code organization or local amendments to those codes, or adopted by the Parish, enacted solely to address imminent threats of destruction of property or injury to persons to the extent not consistent with the terms of this document.
- (c) "Applicant" means any person who submits an application and is a wireless provider.
- (d) "Application" means a request submitted by an applicant for (i) a building permit to collocate small wireless facilities; or (ii) to approve the installation, modification, or removal of a utility pole, telecommunication tower, small wireless facility, or wireless support structure.
- (e) "Parish-owned Pole" means a utility pole owned or operated by the Parish and located within a public right-of-way, or a right-of-way granted to TPCG.
- (f) "Collocate" means to install, mount, maintain, modify, operate, or replace wireless facilities on or adjacent to a wireless support structure or utility pole. "Collocation" has a corresponding meaning.
- (g) "Day" means a calendar day.
- (h) "Fee" means a one-time charge.
- (i) "Parish" or "TPCG" means Terrebonne Parish Consolidated Government.
- (j) "Person" means any natural or juridical person, including the Parish.
- (k) "Rate" means a recurring charge.
- (l) "Rights-of-way" or "ROW" means a public right-of-way within the jurisdiction of the Parish.
- (m) "Small Wireless Facility" means a wireless facility that meets both of the following qualifications: (1) the antenna is located inside an enclosure of no more than six (6) cubic feet in volume and (2) all of the wireless equipment associated with the facility has a cumulative volume of no more than twenty-eight (28) cubic feet. In the case of an antenna that has exposed elements, (1) the antenna and all of its exposed elements shall fit within an imaginary enclosure of not more than six (6) cubic feet and (2) all of the wireless equipment associated with the facility has a cumulative volume of no more than twenty-eight (28) cubic feet. The following types of associated ancillary equipment are not included in the calculation of equipment volume: electric meter, concealment elements, telecommunications demarcation box, ground-based enclosures, grounding equipment, power transfer switch, cut-off switch, and vertical cable runs for the connection of power and other services.

- (n) "Stealth" or "stealth design" means a method of camouflaging any wireless facility or antenna, tower, utility pole, or wireless support structure, including, but not limited to, supporting electrical or mechanical equipment, which is designed to enhance compatibility with adjacent land uses and be as visually unobtrusive as possible. Stealth design may include a repurposed structure.
- (o) "Telecommunications Tower" A tower, pole or similar structure that supports a telecommunications antenna operated for commercial purpose above ground in a fixed location, freestanding, guyed, or on a building, residence or other structure.
- (p) "Utility Pole" means a pole or similar structure that is used in whole or in part for the purpose of carrying electric distribution lines or cables or wires for telecommunications, cable or electric service, or for lighting, traffic control, signage, or a similar function regardless of ownership, including Parish-owned poles. Such term shall not include structures supporting only Wireless Facilities.
- (q) "Wireless Facility" means equipment at a fixed location that enables wireless communications between user equipment and a communications network, including: (i) equipment associated with wireless communications; and (ii) radio transceivers, antennas, coaxial or fiber-optic cable, regular and backup power supplies, and comparable equipment, regardless of technological configuration. The term includes small wireless facilities. The term does not include the structure or improvements on, under, or within which the equipment is collocated.
- (r) "Wireless Infrastructure Provider" means any person, including a person authorized to provide telecommunications service in the state, that builds or installs wireless communication transmission equipment, wireless facilities or wireless support structures, but that is not a wireless services provider.
- (s) "Wireless Provider" means a wireless infrastructure provider or a wireless services provider.
- (t) "Wireless Services" means any services, whether at a fixed location or mobile, provided using wireless facilities.
- (u) "Wireless Services Provider" means a person who provides wireless services.
- (v) "Wireless Support Structure" means a freestanding structure, such as a monopole, tower, either guyed or self-supporting, billboards, or, other existing or proposed structure designed to support or capable of supporting wireless facilities. Such term shall not include a utility pole.

#### Sec. 6-177 - Permit; application and fees.

- (a) Permit required. No person shall place, modify, or remove a telecommunication tower or small wireless facility without first filing the appropriate building permit application and obtaining a permit therefore.
- (b) Commencement of Application Review. No application review, or application review timeline under any applicable law, shall commence until an application is delivered to and deemed complete by the Director of the Planning and Zoning Department or designee. Applications for wireless facilities which require other permits, including, but not limited to, zoning and building permits, shall not be considered complete until Applicant has made complete application for those other permits, as well.
- (c) Application requirements. The application shall be made by the telecommunication or wireless provider, or its duly authorized representative as may be required by law, and shall contain the following information:

#### 1. New facility:

a. The applicant's name, address, telephone numbers, and e-mail addresses;

- b. The telecommunication or wireless provider's name, address, telephone numbers, and e-mail addresses, if different from applicant;
- c. An electronic parish-wide site plan in GIS format, indicating locations and types of all of Applicant's permitted wireless facilities;
- d. A site-specific plan indicating the location of the proposed wireless facility, including physical address and longitude and latitude coordinates, and its relation to other wireless facilities, adjacent properties, the zone of adjacent properties, and the distance from the nearest residence;
- e. If the proposed wireless facility is to be placed on property owned by anyone other than the Parish, the application must include a site-specific statement of consent from the property owners.
- f. If the proposed wireless facility is to be placed on Parish Property, the application must include (1) a Letter of No Objection from the Parish, and (2) a fully executed Standard Right-of-Way Use Agreement, available at Form 2 of Appendix C, Standard Forms, of the Terrebonne Parish Code of Ordinances;
- g. Manufacturer's specifications on all equipment;
- h. Digital drawing to scale indicating the elevation profile of the structure with heights of proposed antennas, heights designated for future attachment (if any), any equipment shed or cabinets, cabling, etc. and the location in relation to existing wireless facilities (with carrier names and antenna type). **DRAWINGS MUST BE STAMPED BY A LOUISIANA PROFESSIONAL ENGINEER**.
- i. Any special exceptions or approvals as may be required by the Houma Board of Adjustment or Houma Historic District Commission.
- 2. Modifications, including improvements, alterations, additions, or replacements to existing wireless facilities:
  - a. The applicant's name, address, telephone numbers, and e-mail addresses;
  - b. The telecommunication or wireless provider's name, address, telephone numbers, and e-mail addresses, if different from applicant;
  - c. Vicinity map providing location of wireless facility to be modified, including physical address;
  - d. Manufacturer's specifications on all equipment
  - e. Digital drawing to scale indicating the elevation profile of the structure with heights of proposed antennas, heights designated for future attachment (if any), any equipment shed or cabinets, cabling, etc., and proposed modifications. **DRAWINGS MUST BE STAMPED BY A LOUISIANA PROFESSIONAL ENGINEER**.
  - f. Any special exceptions or approvals as may be required by the Houma Board of Adjustment or Houma Historic District Commission.
- (d) Time for response. The TPCG shall comply with any applicable federal, state, or local laws governing the time for response to an application under this Section. Notwithstanding any law to the contrary, TPCG shall respond to the application within a reasonable time.
- (e) Rejected application. If an application is rejected, the applicant shall be required to file a new application.
- (f) Effect of Permit. A permit from the Parish authorizes an applicant to undertake only certain activities in accordance with this Chapter and does not create a property right

- or grant authority to the applicant to impinge upon the rights of others who may already have an interest in the rights-of-ways
- (g) Routine maintenance. An application shall not be required for routine maintenance.
- (h) Information updates. Any amendment to information contained in a permit application shall be submitted in writing to the parish within thirty (30) days after the change necessitating the amendment.
- (i) Permit application fees. Application fees for new small wireless facilities or modifications to existing small wireless facilities shall be paid at the time of the application in the amount(s) set forth in Table 1409.2.2(4) of Section 109 of the Terrebonne Parish Building Code (Terrebonne Parish Code of Ordinances, Article VI, Chapter 6, Appendix A).
- (j) Additional costs. Should the TPCG determine that a permit application fee is insufficient to cover TPCG's costs associated with the application, the TPCG may invoice Applicant and Applicant shall reimburse the TPCG for those additional costs. Costs may include, but are not limited to staff resources; hired professionals such as engineers, architects, planners, attorneys, telecommunications, and contractors; and post-installation inspection expenses. The Parish shall provide the Applicant with an invoice itemizing additional costs due, including backup information, and Applicant shall reimburse TPCG in full within thirty days from the date of the invoice.
- (k) TPCG may withhold approval of any permit application until Applicant reimburses the TPCG in full for these costs. In the event Applicant fails to pay the additional costs invoiced under this section, and TPCG places the invoice in the hands of an attorney for collection, the Applicant shall be charged with and liable to pay judicial interest from date of invoice, as well as TPCG's attorney's fees, expenses, and costs. TPCG may also revoke Applicant's permit for non-payment.

Sec. 6-178 – Removal, Relocation or Abandonment of Small Wireless Facilities.

- (a) Within ninety (90) days following written notice from the Parish, wireless provider shall, at its own expense, protect, support, temporarily or permanently disconnect, remove, relocate, change or alter the position of any small wireless facilities within the rights-of-way whenever the Parish has determined that such removal, relocation, change or alteration, is reasonably necessary for the construction, repair, maintenance, or installation of any Parish improvement, in or upon, or the operations of the Parish in or upon, the rights-of-way.
- (b) The Parish retains the right and privilege to cut or move any small wireless facility located within the rights-of-way of the Parish, as the Parish may determine to be necessary, appropriate or useful in response to any public health or safety emergency. If circumstances permit, the Parish shall notify the wireless provider and provide the wireless provider an opportunity to move its own facilities prior to cutting or removing a facility and shall notify the wireless provider after cutting or removing a small wireless facility.
- (c) Abandonment of facilities. The wireless provider shall notify the parish in writing within ninety (90) days of its abandonment of a small wireless facility within the rights-of-way of the parish. Following receipt of such notice the parish may direct the wireless provider to remove all or any portion of the small wireless facility and/or its support structure if the parish, or any of its departments, determines that such removal will be in the best interest of the public health, safety and welfare. Failure of the wireless provider to remove the abandoned small wireless facility and/or support structure within thirty (30) days of direction by the parish shall subject the wireless provider to continued annual charges for Right of Way Rates applied to the abandoned facility until such time the Parish removes the facility and/or support structure itself. Any costs incurred by the Parish for the removal of the abandoned facility and/or support structure shall be charged to the wireless provider.

Sec. 6-179 – Small Wireless Facilities Design Manual

The design and placement of Small Wireless Facilities shall be in compliance with Appendix B, Small Wireless Facilities Design Manual, of this Chapter 6 of the Terrebonne Parish Code of Ordinances.

Sec. 6-180 – Right of Way Use Fees.

- (a) Annual Fees. A wireless provider permitted to place small wireless facilities within the rights-of-way shall pay to the parish annual fees for use of the parish rights-of-way as follows:
  - 1. \$270.00 per year for each new Pole or Support Structure installed for the support of a small wireless facility, which supports no more than one small wireless facility;
  - 2. \$170.00 per year for each small wireless facility installed on an existing Pole or Support Structure, resulting in the co-location of the permitted small wireless facility;
  - 3. \$170.00 per year for each small wireless facility installed on a Parish-owned Pole or Parish-owned Support Structure.
- (b) Annual fees are due in advance and shall not be prorated for partial annual use.
- (c) The first annual fee for each permitted small wireless facility shall be due at the time of permit approval, but before a formal permit is issued.
- (d) Subsequent annual fees shall be billed to the Provider on an annual basis, on or around the first month of each year. Payment is due at receipt of invoice.
- (e) Cease payment. A wireless provider is authorized to remove its facilities from the rights-of-way upon providing the parish with at least thirty (30) days written notice and cease paying the parish compensation for use of the rights-of-way after removal of its facilities.
- (f) Make-ready. For parish-owned utility poles in the rights-of-way, the parish shall provide a good faith estimate for any make-ready work necessary to enable the pole to support the requested small wireless facility, including pole replacement if necessary, within sixty (60) days after receipt of a completed request. Make-ready work including any pole replacement shall be completed within sixty (60) days of written acceptance of the good faith estimate by the wireless provider.

#### **SECTION IV**

Appendix B, Small Wireless Facilities Design Manual, a copy of which is attached to this Ordinance, shall be and is hereby created and adopted verbatim as an appendix to Chapter 6 of the Terrebonne Parish Code of Ordinances. The attached Appendix B of Chapter 6 shall be published in the Terrebonne Parish Code of Ordinances, and the Department of Planning of Zoning shall retain and maintain a copy for use by the public as occasion may require.

#### **SECTION V**

Table 1409.2.2(4) of Section 109 of the Terrebonne Parish Building Code (Terrebonne Parish Code of Ordinances, Article VI, Chapter 6, Appendix A) shall be and is hereby amended as follows, with underlining indicating additions:

#### **SECTION VI**

Section 28.1, Definitions, of Chapter 28, Zoning, of the Terrebonne Parish Code of Ordinances shall be and is hereby amended to include the following definition in alphabetical order:

Small Wireless Facility: a wireless facility that meets both of the following qualifications: (1) the antenna is located inside an enclosure of no more than six (6) cubic feet in volume and (2) all of the wireless equipment associated with the facility has a cumulative volume of no more than twenty-eight (28) cubic feet. In the case of an antenna that has exposed elements, (1) the antenna and all of its exposed elements shall fit within an imaginary enclosure of not more than six (6) cubic feet and (2) all of the wireless equipment associated with the facility has a cumulative volume of no more than twenty-eight (28) cubic feet. The following types of associated ancillary equipment are not included in the calculation of equipment volume: electric meter, concealment elements, telecommunications demarcation box, ground-based enclosures, grounding equipment, power transfer switch, cut-off switch, and vertical cable runs for the connection of power and other services.

### **SECTION VII**

Section 28-81 shall be and is hereby enacted in Chapter 28, Zoning, of the Terrebonne Parish Code of Ordinances as follows:

Sec. 28-81. - Supplementary Small Wireless Facilities regulations.

Small Wireless Facilities shall be a permitted use in all districts as established in Article III of this Chapter, and as defined and regulated by the

Terrebonne Parish Building Code and Terrebonne Parish Code of Ordinances, Article VI, Chapter 6.

If any word, clause, phrase, section or other portion of this ordinance shall be declared null, void, invalid, illegal, or unconstitutional, the remaining words, clauses, phrases, sections and other portions of this ordinance shall remain in full force and effect, the provisions of this ordinance hereby being declared to be severable.

This ordinance shall become effective upon approval by the Parish President or as otherwise provided in Section 2-13(b) of the Home Rule Charter for a Consolidated Government for Terrebonne Parish, whichever occurs sooner.

#### Small Wireless Facilities Design Manual Appendix B of Chapter 6 Terrebonne Parish Code of Ordinances

Building permits for new installation, additions to, alterations to, or replacements of any small wireless facilities may be issued under the design provisions listed below. This Manual, however, is not intended to supersede or conflict with engineering, technical, or operational requirements found in the Terrebonne Parish Code of Ordinances and its appendices and Standard Form Agreements.

#### B. General site requirements. Small wireless facilities:

- (a) shall not interfere with the use of streets, street furniture (e.g., signs, benches, mailboxes) sidewalks, alleys, parkways, and other public ways, public services, and public places;
- (b) shall not interfere with the facilities and operations of facilities lawfully located in rights-of-way, servitudes, easements, public or private property;
- (c) shall provide for the antenna to be located inside an enclosure of no more than six (6)cubic feet in volume and all of the wireless equipment associated with the facility has a cumulative volume of no more than twenty-eight (28) cubic feet, or in the case of an antenna that has exposed elements, the antenna and all of its exposed elements could fit within an imaginary enclosure of not more than six (6)cubic feet and all of the wireless equipment associated with the facility has a cumulative volume of no more than twenty-eight (28) cubic feet;

- (d) The following types of associated ancillary equipment are not included in the calculation of equipment volume: electric meter, concealment elements, telecommunications demarcation box, ground-based enclosures, grounding equipment, power transfer switch, cut-off switch, and vertical cable runs for the connection of power and other services
- (e) shall design its base or support equipment to be pole-mounted in a manner to maintain a visual appeal;
  - (a) Applicant may apply for a waiver of this requirement when such installation is not possible.
  - (b) Waiver is subject to approval by Planning and Zoning Director's or designee's sole discretion.
- (f) shall incorporate into its design a method for quick disconnect for the power source, and shutoff shall be accessible by TPCG, SLECA or Entergy;
- (g) shall not create visual or physical obstructions and other conditions that are hazardous to vehicular and pedestrian traffic;
- (h) shall not be located less than one thousand five hundred (1,500') feet, measured pole to pole, from the nearest telecommunication tower or small wireless facility in any given direction, unless collocating;
- (i) shall not adversely affect the Parish's ability to perform normal parish functions or furnish normal parish services in the vicinity of the location of placement;
- (j) shall not result in the Parish incurring costs/expenditures in money/personnel that have not been reimbursed by Applicant;
- (k) shall protect against environmental damage, including damage to trees and vegetation;
- (l) shall be in continuous compliance with all applicable Federal, State, and local laws including zoning districts;

#### C. <u>Site specific requirements</u>. Small wireless facilities:

- (a) shall comply with the Terrebonne Parish Code and all applicable zoning ordinances of the Parish;
- (b) shall be reflective of the characteristics of the area and incorporate stealth design that mimics the characteristics of the area whenever possible to maintain visual appeal, taking into consideration the special characteristics and requirements of the following, non-exclusive areas;
  - (a) Residential corridors
  - (b) Commercial corridors
  - (c) Rural areas
  - (d) Historic District
  - (e) Commission-Approved Planned Unit Developments
- (c) Shall incorporate stealth and aesthetics to camouflage equipment, cabinets, and any other small wireless facilities accessories, subject to Planning Department approval;
- (d) shall either use existing structures for placement or require a new structure which will not be of the wooden type unless specifically designated to conform or reflect the characteristic of the area to be located;
- (e) shall locate accessories underground to the fullest extent possible.

#### D. <u>Use of Rights-of-Way.</u>

- 1. Small wireless facilities, and new or modified utility poles and wireless support structures for the collocation of small wireless facilities, may be placed within the rights-of-way as a permitted use subject to the following requirements:
  - (a) Shall be accompanied by a Letter of No Objection (LONO) from the manager, operator, or owner of any public property, servitude, right-of-way, or

- easement when located on a public property, servitude, right-of-way, or easement:
- (b) Each new or modified utility pole or wireless support structure installed in the rights-of-way shall not exceed the greater of:
  - 1) Ten (10) feet above the tallest existing utility pole in the rights-ofway in place as of the effective date of this document located within 500 feet of the new pole, or,
  - 2) Fifty (50) feet above ground level.
- (c) New small wireless facilities in the rights-of-way shall not exceed the greater of:
  - 1) More than ten (10) feet above an existing utility pole or wireless support structure in the rights-of-way in place as of the effective date of this document; or,
  - 2) Above the height for a new utility pole or wireless support structure under any other section in this document or relating ordinance(s).
- (d) Notwithstanding any provision in this Manual to the contrary, the construction or modification of any utility pole, wireless support structure or small wireless facility shall be subject, first, to the aesthetic and stealth restrictions as provided for within the Terrebonne Parish Code of Ordinances.
- 2. A permit from the Parish authorizes an applicant to undertake only certain activities in accordance with this document or related ordinance(s), and does not create a property right or grant authority to the applicant to impinge upon the rights of others who may already have an interest in the rights-of-way.

#### E. Application Process Overview:

- (a) No application review, or application review timeline under any applicable law, shall commence until an application is delivered to and deemed complete by the Director of the Planning and Zoning Department or designee.
- (b) No permit shall be issued outside of compliance with applicable law and ordinances.
- (c) Once a permit is issued by the Parish, the work permitted is subject to all enforcement and inspections authorized by the Terrebonne Parish Code.
- (d) Upon completion of the installation work, Applicant shall provide the Parish with an affidavit of compliance, sealed by a professional engineer licensed in the State of Louisiana, certifying all work was carried out consistent with the previously submitted and approved calculations and drawings.
- (e) Upon successful completion of required inspections and Parish's receipt of applicant's affidavit of compliance, Parish may issue a certificate of completion.
- (f) TPCG may use any professional consultants to assist in the application review process.
- (g) Applicant shall comply with any requests made by TPCG within 30 days of the date of request unless TPCG grants an extension.

The Chairwoman recognized the public for comments on the following:

B. A proposed ordinance that will authorize the Parish President to enter into a Cooperative Endeavor Agreement with the Houma-Terrebonne Soccer Association, and Terrebonne Recreation District Number 2-3 for the purpose of operating, administering, and maintaining Recreation Soccer Programs for the youth and citizens of Terrebonne Parish at the Soccer Complex located at the Terrebonne Parish Bayou Country Sports Park.

The Chairwoman recognized Mr. Daniel Bruce, Houma-Terrebonne Soccer Association Board President, who thanked the Council for considering the cooperative endeavor agreement.

The Chairwoman recognized Mr. Chris Erny, Houma resident, who shared his optimism for the positive impacts enabled by the proposed agreement with the soccer association as well as some of his experiences in creating earlier drafts of the proposed agreement.

There were no further comments from the public on the proposed ordinance.

Mr. D. J. Guidry moved, seconded by Mr. D. W. Guidry, Sr., "THAT the Council close the aforementioned public hearing."

The Chairwoman called for a vote on the motion offered by Mr. D. J. Guidry. THERE WAS RECORDED:

The Chairwoman declared the motion adopted.

Upon Council Member G. Michel's request, the Chairwoman recognized Mr. Julius Hebert, Parish Attorney, who clarified that up to half of the monies received by Terrebonne Parish for soccer events could be distributed to Recreation District No. 2,3 for the purposes of field maintenance. He then clarified that Terrebonne Parish does have a right to host events on the soccer fields as well, and that a renewal agreement would be considered at no charge as the agreed-upon charges for field completion would have been compensated for by that time. He then stated that there are provisions within the agreement allowing for the Parish's use of the fields without charge and for the termination of the agreement by either party.

Upon Council Member J. Navy's request, the Chairwoman recognized Mr. Christopher Pulaski, Planning & Zoning Director, who stated the Master Plan for the Air Base Park included soccer fields meant to work in concert with those at the Sports Complex and previously designated soccer fields could be renovated for use again with appropriate maintenance and coordination with the recreation districts.

Council Member D. W. Guidry, Sr. congratulated the Soccer Association on its success and shared his support for the association for providing soccer programs to Terrebonne Parish. He then stated that the agreement had already been approved by Recreation District No. 2, 3 as well.

Upon Council Member S. Trosclair's request, the Chairwoman recognized Mr. Roddy Lerille, Recreation Director, who stated that there were no plans for providing soccer programs through Terrebonne Parish Recreation at this time as neither funding nor enough staff were available to provide for the programs.

Council Member S. Trosclair suggested that the Recreation Department ask if those current volunteers working with the department would consider being part of a soccer

program then shared his concerns for Recreation Department spending being isolated to specific areas and shared his support for an expansion of recreation programs to include all of Terrebonne Parish.

Council Member D. J. Guidry shared his concerns for Parish residents who lack convenient access to soccer facilities and suggested that steps be taken to provide for more facilities across the Parish. Mr. Lerille clarified that the fields and facilities are the responsibility of the recreation districts, not the Recreation Department, and that he could contact those potential districts to determine if they could provide such facilities.

Council Member J. Navy shared his concerns regarding a potential disparity in supporting recreation projects and programs across the Parish and suggested that changes could be made to reduce potential disparity and improve recreation for the Parish overall.

The Chairwoman recognized Mr. Julius Hebert who clarified that the agreement included a provision regarding specialty vendors not being considered as concessions which called for alternate procedures when allocating money received by the Parish.

The Chairwoman recognized Mr. Gordon Dove, Parish President, who stated that he would meet with the Recreation Department and Recreation Districts to discuss the creation of and provisions for a soccer program for all areas of the Parish.

Council Member C. Duplantis-Prather suggested that improving the Air Base Park could provide greater venues for recreation then shared her support for new or expanded recreation programs in Terrebonne Parish.

Council Member D. W. Guidry, Sr., shared his support for the expansion of Parish recreation programs and suggested that the Parish should look to meet the current demand for more soccer programming and facilities across the Parish.

The Chairwoman recognized Mr. Mike Toups, Parish Manager, who offered some potential difficulties that would need to be overcome then suggested that some time be allowed for the appropriate planning and budgeting to take place so the Parish could begin providing Parishwide soccer programming.

Upon Council Member C. Duplantis-Prather's request, the Chairwoman recognized Ms. Gabrielle Erny, Houma-Terrebonne Soccer Association Registrar, who gave an overview of the programs offered by the Soccer Association and shared the Soccer Association's support for providing soccer programming Parishwide.

Council Member S. Dryden shared his experiences as a parent with children participating in the Soccer Association's programming then shared his concerns for the current sustainability of multiple soccer programs across the Parish without additional fields and facilities being provided for and made accessible.

### **ORDINANCE NO. 9038**

AUTHORIZING THE PARISH PRESIDENT TO ENTER INTO A COOPERATIVE ENDEAVOR AGREEMENT WITH THE HOUMA-TERREBONNE SOCCER ASSOCIATION, AND TERREBONNE RECREATION DISTRICT NUMBER 2-3 FOR THE PURPOSE OF OPERATING, ADMINISTERING, AND MAINTAINING RECREATIONAL SOCCER PROGRAMS FOR THE YOUTH AND CITIZENS OF TERREBONNE PARISH AT THE SOCCER COMPLEX LOCATED AT THE TERREBONNE PARISH BAYOU COUNTRY SPORTS PARK.

#### **SECTION I**

WHEREAS, Article VII, Section 14 of the Louisiana Constitution provides that, "[F]or public purpose, the state and its political subdivisions or political corporations may

engage in cooperative endeavors with each other, with the United States or its agencies, or with any public or private corporation or individual"; and

- **WHEREAS**, Louisiana Revised Statute 33:4553 grants TPCG broad authority in developing and administering recreational facilities within the parish, and is authorized by its Home Rule Charter to pass all resolutions and/or ordinances requisite or necessary to promote, protect and preserve the general welfare, safety, health, peace and good order of the parish; and
- **WHEREAS**, TPCG and HTSA share a goal of contributing to the advancement of recreational opportunities within the parish and elevating Terrebonne Parish to the forefront of state-wide recreation; and
- **WHEREAS**, a multi-purpose sports complex, including soccer fields, within Terrebonne Parish has long been envisioned by parish planners as an integral part of our growth as a progressive and diverse parish; and
- **WHEREAS**, in furtherance of this goal, on December 27, 2012, TPCG purchased a large tract of land and commenced development of a multi-purpose sports complex, known as the Bayou Country Sports Park ("Sports Park"), located at 4374 Highway 311, Houma, LA, in Terrebonne Parish, being more particularly described in Exhibit A annexed hereto and made a part of this Agreement; and
- **WHEREAS**, on February 15, 2016, pursuant to Ordinance No. 8649, TPCG purchased property for the Sports Park, previously optioned in the original 2012 sale; and
- **WHEREAS**, on February 1, 2013, TPCG and District 2-3 entered into an Intergovernmental Agreement whereby TPCG granted District 2-3 a Right of Maintenance and Use of the land constituting the Sports Park, provided that District 2-3 maintains the property and implements the Master Plan, as may be amended, for the Sports Park, duly recorded in the conveyance records of Terrebonne Parish at Conveyance Book 2317, Page 421, under Entry No. 1419034; and
- **WHEREAS**, on April 1, 2016, TPCG and District 2-3 entered into an Amendment No. 1 to the above Intergovernmental Agreement, duly recorded in the conveyance records of Terrebonne Parish under Entry No. 1503708; and
- WHEREAS, TPCG and HTSA believe that the advancement of soccer fields at the Sports Park is in the best interest of all residents of Terrebonne Parish, especially since the Site is located within an area of high residential growth, present and future, and on property currently owned by TPCG, and highly visible to the public, and a high elevation, and along a public transit route, and amongst adjacent civic uses and structures; and
- **WHEREAS**, TPCG and HTSA believe that the promotion of soccer and soccer related events as a tourist attraction provides an economic benefit to the Terrebonne Parish community; and
- WHEREAS, TPCG desires to cooperate in furtherance of this goal by entering into this agreement with HTSA in which TPCG grants HTSA the Right of Use of a portion of the Sports Park pursuant to the conditions contained herein for use as soccer fields, provided that HTSA maintains the soccer fields portion of the Sports Park consistent with the Master Plan, as may be amended; and
- **WHEREAS**, the mission of the HTSA is to provide instructional and recreation opportunities to the youth of Terrebonne Parish in the form of supervised soccer leagues; and
- **WHEREAS**, TPCG and HTSA believe they can substantially benefit the recreational and enrichment opportunities for the youth of Terrebonne Parish by entering into a cooperative endeavor with each other; and
- WHEREAS, TPCG and HTSA find that providing the soccer fields for the terms of this cooperative endeavor agreement will serve a public purpose whose costs are not

gratuitous given the significant advancement in recreational opportunities in Terrebonne Parish it creates; and

WHEREAS, legal counsel for all parties have approved the agreement; and

**NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED**, by the Terrebonne Parish Council (Community Development and Planning Committee), on behalf of the Terrebonne Parish Consolidated Government, that the Parish President, Gordon E. Dove, be and he is authorized to execute the Cooperative Endeavor Agreement by and between the Terrebonne Parish Consolidated Government, Houma-Terrebonne Soccer Association, and Terrebonne Recreation District Number 2-3.

#### **ORDINANCE NO. 9041**

AN ORDINANCE CREATING THE SCHRIEVER FIRE PREVENTION BUREAU AS A CERTIFIED FIRE PREVENTION AGENCY AND DEFINING THE INTENT, PURPOSE AND ORGANIZATION OF SAID BUREAU AND PROVIDING FOR RELATED MATTERS.

#### **SECTION 1**

**WHEREAS**, the Terrebonne Parish Council and the Schriever Fire Protection District in the interest of the health safety and welfare of its citizens desire to enhance protection of citizens and property from the ravages of fire; and

**WHEREAS**, the Terrebonne Parish Council on behalf of the TPCG and the Schriever Fire Protection District believes it is in the best interest of the citizens in the Schriever Fire Protection District that the District be established as a State Fire Marshal Certified Fire Prevention Bureau to allow local fire prevention service responsibilities to be delegated by the Office of the State Fire Marshal;

WHEREAS, <u>La.</u> R.S. 40:1578.7,(C) states, where a fire prevention code is adopted by any political subdivision of the state, it must adopt the State Uniform Fire Prevention Code (NFPA 1) as from time to time amended and otherwise enforced by the Office of the State Fire Marshal:

**NOW, THEREFORE BE IT ORDAINED**, by the Terrebonne Parish Council, on behalf of the Terrebonne Parish Consolidated Government that the Parish Code, Chapter 8 "Fire Protection & Prevention" be and hereby is amended to add a new ARTICLE VI, "Schriever Fire Prevention Bureau" as follows:

#### TERREBONNE PARISH CODE CHAPTER 8 – FIRE PROTECTION AND PREVENTION ARTICLE VI – SCHRIEVER FIRE PREVENTION BUREAU

#### Section 8-90: Bureau Established

The Schriever Fire Prevention Bureau is hereby established to operate under the control and within the jurisdiction of the Schriever Fire Protection District to protect citizens and property through the local provision of guidance and enforcement services set out in state law and delegated to the Bureau, upon certification, by the State Fire Marshal, in which endeavor it

shall uphold and administer all relevant and duly adopted laws, codes and regulations of the State of Louisiana and the Parish of Terrebonne.

#### Section 8-91: Schriever Fire Prevention Bureau

The Schriever Fire Prevention Bureau (hereinafter within Chapter 8 Article VI referred to as the "Bureau") shall be headed by the Schriever Fire Protection District Operation Manager (hereinafter, within Chapter 8 Article VI, referred to as the "Manager"). State Fire Marshal commissioned Fire Inspectors of Schriever Fire Protection District (hereinafter after, within Chapter 8 Article VI, referred to as "Fire Inspector") and Bureau shall have delegated responsibility and authority, from the Operation Manager and State Fire Marshall, for proper discharge of the Bureau's functions.

#### Section 8-92: Duties and Responsibilities

- A. The code official responsible for the administration of the codes adopted herein shall be the Manager who shall hold such authority for the jurisdiction.
- B. The Bureau, Manager and Fire Inspectors, acting in accordance with state law and local codes, shall ensure:
  - (1) The prevention of fires through fire and life safety code enforcement;
  - (2) The proper and safe storage and use of explosives and flammables;
  - (3) The safe installation and maintenance of automatic and other fire alarm systems, and fire extinguishing equipment;
  - (4) The provision of proper water supply through the placement and regulation of fire hydrants and fire department connections;
  - (5) The means and adequacy of ingress and egress by fire department personnel, in case of fire or emergency, to and from buildings and all other places in which numbers of persons work, live, or assemble from time to time for any purpose;
  - (6) Investigation of the origin, cause, and circumstances of every fire occurring within the Schriever Fire Protection District to determine if the fire was a result of carelessness, design or an intentional act. Any fire that is or could possibly be due to an intentional or malicious act shall be treated as a crime scene and the department retains the authority contained in RS 40:1563.1, to further investigate the circumstances and determine the person or persons responsible. The Sheriff's Office shall, upon request, assist the fire department in the investigation of suspicious fires.
  - (7) The maintenance of fire cause and loss records;
  - (8) Information and outreach education on matters of fire safety to citizens located within its area;
  - (9) Inspect, or cause to be inspected, all structures, except one and two family dwellings and movables, for the purpose of reducing or eliminating fire hazards. Such inspection shall not include initial final inspections which shall continue to be handled by the Office of State Fire Marshal.
  - (10) Copies of inspection reports in proper format shall be filed with the state fire marshall's office.
  - (11) Continued education as necessary to maintain Bureau standing through a training program recognized by the Office of State Fire Marshal.
  - (12) Perform such other duties set forth in other sections of this Code of Ordinances, and as imposed from time to time by law or by the Louisiana State Fire Marshal acting in the lawful discharge of his office.

#### Section 8-93: Codes Adopted.

The State Uniform Fire Prevention Code as adopted by LA Revised Statute 40:1578.7 and Louisiana Administrative Code Title 55: V: 103 and the most current edition of the LA State Fire Marshal's Act and the editions of NFPA 1 Fire Code and NFPA 101 Life Safety Code most recently adopted by the Office of the State Fire Marshal, all as may from time to time be amended by the State Legislature, are hereby adopted and incorporated as if set out in their entirety, herein.

Not less than one copy of the most current adopted issue of the Uniform Fire Prevention Code, life safety code, and the adopted standards and codes adopted herein shall be filed in the office of the Bureau and the provisions thereof shall be enforced within the limits of the Bureau.

#### Section 8-94: - Appeals from decision of the Operation Manager.

Appeals of orders, decisions, or determinations made by the Manager, relative to the application and interpretation of this Article VI, shall be heard by the *Board of Appeals* established in Appendix A, Section 113 of the *Terrebonne Parish Consolidated Building Code*, under the terms and provisions as therein adopted for the hearing of appeals of orders, decisions, or determinations made by the building official.

#### **Section 8-95: Enforcement.**

The codes adopted in Article VI. Section 8-93, shall be enforced by the Operation Manager.

#### Section 8-96<sup>i</sup>: Violations, penalties.

The procedure and penalties for violations of this Article VI shall follow the procedures adopted in Appendix A, Section 114 of the *Terrebonne Parish Consolidated Building Code* with "*Code Official*" substituted for the words "*Building Official*" wherever they appear.

#### **SECTION II**

If any word, clause, phrase, section or other portion of this ordinance shall be declared null, void, invalid, illegal, or unconstitutional, the remaining words, clauses, phrases, sections and other portions of this ordinance shall remain in full force and effect, the provisions of this ordinance hereby being declared to be severable.

AN ORDINANCE TO AUTHORIZE THE ACQUISITION OF PROPERTY, SITES AND/OR SERVITUDES REQUIRED IN CONNECTION WITH AND/OR FOR FORCED DRAINAGE PROJECT 1-1A (STATEWIDE FLOOD CONTROL); AUTHORIZE THE PARISH PRESIDENT TO EXECUTE ANY AND ALL DOCUMENTS NECESSARY TO ACQUIRE SITES, PROPERTY, SURFACE RIGHTS AND/OR SERVITUDES FOR THE SAID PURPOSES; AND TO PROVIDE FOR OTHER MATTERS RELATIVE THERETO.

#### **SECTION I**

BE IT ORDAINED by the Terrebonne Parish Council, in due, regular and legal sessions convened, that the Parish Administration, in addition to any prior authorization, is hereby authorized to acquire from Shell Oil Company and/or SWEPI, LP and/or any of their affiliated entities and/or any other entity or entities or owners, by sale, donation or otherwise, including but not limited to a sale and/or transfer for \$1.00, and to pay all of the costs associated with the acquisition of any and all property in full ownership and/or surface rights and/or servitudes that are required to facilitate drainage and/or construction and/or maintenance of the Forced Drainage Project 1-lA (Statewide Flood Control); that the Parish President, Gordon E. Dove, is hereby authorized and empowered for and on behalf of the Terrebonne Parish Consolidated Government to execute documents necessary to acquire from Shell Oil Company and/or SWEPI, LP and/or any of their affiliated entities and/or any other entity or entities or owners, by sale, donation or otherwise, including but not limited to a sale and/or transfer for \$1.00, and to pay all of the costs associated with the acquisition the sites, property in full ownership and/or surface rights and/or servitudes for the above stated purpose for consideration he deems just and reasonable, not to exceed the fair market value.

#### **SECTION II**

FORCED DRAINAGE PROJECT 1-IA PARISH OF TERREBONNE

This portion of the project generally facilitates drainage in connection with Forced Drainage Project 1-1A (Statewide Flood Control), and includes an area located between Bayou Terrebonne and LA Hwy. 311 from the vicinity of Savanne Road and heading in a northerly direction therefrom, and includes but is not limited to property located in Township 16 South, Range 16 Est, including Sections and/or portions of Sections 61, 62, 63, 64, 66, 67, 68 and 69 and Township 16 South, Range 17 East, including Sections and/or portions of Sections 83 and 90. By adding this drainage area, it will provide flood relief under peak storm conditions and manage water levels in the area.

The Chairwoman announced that the Parish Council may consider resolutions calling for an election with regard to taxes after a public hearing to be held on April 24, 2019 at 6:00 p.m. at its Regular Meeting Place, Council Meeting Room, Government Tower, 8026 Main Street, Houma, LA 70360.

Mr. J. Navy moved, seconded by Ms. C. Duplantis-Prather, "THAT, Mr. Lucia's time to speak be extended by one minute."

Mr. Lucia then shared his concerns for Uber and Lyft services being provided in Terrebonne Parish in the future and its potentially negative impacts.

The Chairwoman recognized Mr. Eric Peterson, driver for Gulf Coast Connections Plus, who shared his experiences as a driver for Uber and other taxi services then shared his concerns for local economies being served by Uber and Lyft services.

Council Member D. W. Guidry, Sr. wished them great success with the new taxi business then stated that the Uber and Lyft services had been repeatedly requested for the area by many local residents.

The Chairwoman recognized Mr. Sam Stines, Terrebonne Mosquito Control biologist, who gave a brief overview of the procedures being following by Terrebonne Mosquito Control to treat for mosquitoes and the effects of their chemicals on other creatures. Mr. Stines stated that the chemicals being used were not toxic to humans nor to bees as had been reported to him by members of the public and encouraged the public to contact Mosquito Control for additional information, registration, or special requests.

The Chairwoman recognized Mr. DaJuan Sanders, Terrebonne All-Stars basketball coach, shared his experiences regarding the typical practice of the Parish to fund the travel expenses for their All-Star teams to compete and then shared his concerns regarding a potential lack of funding available for the several All-Star teams competing at or qualifying to compete at national tournaments.

It was at this time the Chairwoman A. Williams ceded the Chair to the Vice-Chairman A. Marmande.

A discussion ensued relative to the funding required to accommodate travel expenses for the upcoming All-Star basketball tournaments.

The Vice-Chairman recognized Ms. Kandace Mauldin, Chief Financial Officer, who reported that Administration has been investigating the total funding that can be made available for the All-Star teams with plans being considered to distribute equal portions of that funding to each of the qualifying or competing teams for the season.

Upon the Chairwoman's request, the Vice-Chairman recognized Mr. Roddy Lerille, Recreation Director, who explained that the historical practice for funding a qualifying All-Star team to compete at the national tournament was based on their achieving first or second place standings and that the 11-year-old team placed third which could allow them to participate but does not include the provision for increased sponsorship.

The Chairwoman suggested that the travel expenses could be reduced through bulkrate pricing if it was requested by Parish Government and that a closer review be completed regarding budgeting that would provide for those successful local teams sport looking to compete at higher levels.

Council Member G. Michel suggested that fundraising events could be utilized to provide for additional funding for the travel expenses and shared his concerns that similar funding issues could occur with any of the other competitive programs offered by Terrebonne Parish Recreation.

Council Member J. Navy reiterated his concerns for budgeting decisions made regarding Recreation and suggested that improvements should be made toward improving and supporting recreation programs across Terrebonne Parish.

The Chairwoman suggested that the accommodations provided for by the All-Star program could also be reviewed to determine if changes were necessary to ensure fairness and clarity of expectations if current trends were to continue.

Upon Council Member G. Michel's request, Ms. Kandace Mauldin clarified that the recently adopted budget amendment for the Sports Complex included but was limited to funding drainage improvements, concessions, and pipe installations.

It was at this time that the Chairwoman A. Williams resumed the Chair.

Council Member G. Michel then shared his optimism for the positive impacts Parishwide that the additional funding being spent to complete facilities at the Sports Complex would provide.

A discussion ensued relative to the measures available to the Parish and the All-Star teams for achieving the necessary funds for travel expenses for those teams whose national-level tournaments were being held in the near future.

Council Member S. Dryden suggested that a set of rules and guidelines be established to better determine necessary qualifications and funding for these All-Star teams to prevent similar issues from reoccurring in the future.

The Chairwoman recognized Mr. Jahyri Coleman, Terrebonne All-Stars basketball coach, shared his concerns regarding available funding for the All-Star teams and potential issues with fairness across the various sports offered by Recreation.

Council Member S. Dryden reiterated a need for a set of guidelines to define and determine budgeting demands for the All-Star teams as well as guidelines for determining travel accommodations.

Council Member D. W. Guidry, Sr. concurred with the need for detailed guidelines to determine more appropriate budgetary projections and procedures for requesting and obtaining travel accommodations.

The Councilwoman recognized Ms. Aretha Celestin, Houma resident, who shared some of her experiences as a parent of an All-Star team member and the greater financial demands beyond providing travel or food expenses for her child to compete.

Council Member J. Navy requested that Administration investigate available funding to accommodate the All-Star team competing over the next weekend and concurred with a need to determine better guidelines and budgeting to prevent the issue from reoccurring.

The Chairwoman called for a report on the Public Services Committee meeting held on 3/25/19, whereupon the Committee Chairman rendered the following:

She continued that \$1,357,897.00 was allocated for program funding and \$19,478.00 was allocated for Training and Technical Assistance. Terrebonne Parish Consolidated Government is required to provide a 20% NFS match of \$344,319.00 to the Head Start Program. General Fund allocated \$565,431.00 for Head Start during the current fiscal year. The Community Development Block Grant provided \$12,000.00. Ms. Powell gave detailed statistical information regarding the School Readiness Program administered by Head Start, as well as, the number of children funded for this fiscal year. She stated that the total actual number of children enrolled in the program for the school year 2017-2018 was 199. Head Start also serves children with disabilities and for the 2017-2018 school year, they served 35 children who had diagnosed disabilities. The Head Start Program is a sponsor of the Child and Adult Care Food Program and receives a reimbursement from USDA/LA Department of Education for the meals served to the children. Through December 2018, Head Start received \$144,986.33 from the Department of Education/USDA. Total food costs through December 2018 were \$210,816.80. The total meals served from January through December 2018 are as follows: Breakfast: 24,029, Lunch: 23,435 and PM Snack: 20,677. The Terrebonne Foundation for Academic Excellence is continuing to fund the cost for all Head Start children to receive a book each month from the Dolly Parton Imagination Library.

Ms. Powell thanked the Council and Administration for all of their support. She stated that they also receive support from Mr. Michael St. Martin and the Senior Class of Vandebilt Catholic High School.

Several Committee Members thanked Ms. Powell and her staff for all of their hard work in getting the younger children ready to enter into school; and stated that the Head Start Program is a value asset to the children and parents throughout Terrebonne Parish.

Committee Member J. Navy asked that Agenda Item No. 2 - Update on property owned by Ms. Bernadine Carter, be placed on the agenda so that status information can be presented to the Committee.

Kellie Cunningham, Community Development Administrator, addressed the Committee relative to the matter of the rehabilitation project repairs at the home of Ms. Bernadine Carter. She distributed a letter from the Stow 'N Go Pod Storage Company concerning this matter, along with other material regarding repairs that were made since the last meeting. Ms. Cunningham stated that she has been in contact with Ms. Janaé McGuin, Ms. Bernadine Carter's (the homeowner) daughter, who is acting as her agent, concerning the cleaning of the furniture. Ms. Cunningham stated that she is waiting for a response from a professional cleaning company regarding the cleaning of the furniture. She also stated that Administration is in negotiation with Stow 'N Go Pod Company regarding compensation for the damages done to the furniture. Ms. Cunningham presented further information regarding the floor replacement issue and explained that the flooring issue, along with other minor repair issues, have been resolved.

Ms. Janaé McGuin, addressed the Committee relative to the matter concerning the rehabilitation repairs to her mother's home and the storage pod issue. Ms. McGuin explained that the flooring issue has been resolved; and added that the previous work done on the property was done by Terrebonne Parish. She also distributed a detailed itemized list of the items in the storage pod that were damaged and need to be replaced. She stated that she brought this matter to the Council because she attempted to contact the owner of Stow' N Go, but he would not get back with her.

Committee Member J. Navy suggested that the vendor speak directly to Administration, not to the homeowner; noting that the parish is trying to resolve this matter.

Parish President G. Dove asked Ms. McGuin to submit a itemized list and an estimated replacement cost value of the furniture that was damaged and Administration will consult with the Parish's Legal Department to resolve this problem.
