The Chairman recognized Mr. Jessie Billiot, Pointe-au-Chien Indian Tribe Councilman, who shared his support of Pointe-au-Chien being included in the RV Park ordinance and added that the island brings shrimp and fishing revenue to the parish.

The Chairman recognized Ms. Lori Elderton, a resident of Houma, who reported on sewerage and drainage concerns in her neighborhood and also requested additional street lighting to be installed in her area.

The Chairman stated that he had contacted Administration and that they completed an assessment of the neighborhood to address those concerns and would discuss with her a plan of action to find viable solutions for her neighborhood.

ORDINANCE NO. 9851

AN ORDINANCE TO AUTHORIZE THE PARISH PRESIDENT TO ENTER INTO A COOPERATIVE ENDEAVOR AGREEMENT WITH THE HAVEN, INC. AND EXECUTE NECESSARY DOCUMENTS FOR THE TRANSFER OF IMMOVABLE PROPERTY FROM TERREBONNE PARISH CONSOLIDATED GOVERNMENT TO THE HAVEN, INC. AND TO PROVIDE FOR RELATED MATTERS.

WHEREAS, the Terrebonne Parish Consolidated Government owns certain immovable property located in Terrebonne Parish, Louisiana, more particularly described as follows, to-wit:

LOT 7 BLOCK 2 DAVIDSON SUBD. ALSO RIGHT OF INGRESS AND EGRESS THROUGH SOUTHERN 15' OF LOT 6 BLOCK 2. ALSO SOUTHERNMOST 8' OF BLOCK 1 DAVIDSON SUBD. CB 231/236 (PARCEL # 41974) (DUNN STREET); and

WHEREAS, said property is the former electrical substation property located off Dunn Street in Houma, Louisiana, behind Haven Inc. at 509 Dunn Street, and was previously declared surplus and not needed for public purposes pursuant to Terrebonne Parish Council Ordinance No. 8050;

WHEREAS, Article VII, Section 14 of the Louisiana Constitution provides that, “[F]or public purpose, the state and its political subdivisions or political corporations may engage in cooperative endeavors with each other, with the United States or its agencies, or with any public or private corporation or individual”; and

WHEREAS, The Haven, Inc. (“The Haven”), a Louisiana nonprofit corporation, indicated to TPCG its willingness and ability to use the Property in furtherance of its purpose in providing services to victims of domestic abuse including providing shelter, counseling, and medical care on the Property and to otherwise benefit the citizens of Terrebonne Parish; and

WHEREAS, TPCG wishes to enter into a Cooperative Endeavor Agreement to transfer the Property to The Haven subject to the condition that The Haven fulfills the obligation of providing services to victims of domestic abuse including providing shelter, counseling, and medical care on the Property and otherwise developing and maintaining the Property; and

WHEREAS, TPCG finds that its expenditure or transfer of the immovable property for the purpose of The Haven providing services to victims of domestic abuse including providing shelter, counseling, and medical care on the Property, taken as a whole, is not gratuitous, and that it has demonstrable objective, and a reasonable expectation of receiving at least equivalent value in exchange for the expenditure or transfer of its public property; and

NOW THEREFORE BE IT ORDAINED by the Terrebonne Parish Council on behalf of the Terrebonne Parish Consolidated Government that:

SECTION I

NOW BE IT ORDAINED by the Terrebonne Parish Council, on behalf of the Terrebonne Parish Consolidated Government, that, conditioned on the revocation and recapture by Terrebonne Parish Consolidated Government of the property described herein from The Haven, the Parish President is hereby authorized to execute and enter into and enforce a Cooperative Endeavor Agreement with The Haven to facilitate the transfer of the Property to The Haven, Inc., and that the Parish President is hereby authorized to execute and enter into and enforce a transfer of said Property to The Haven upon the satisfactory performance of the Cooperative Endeavor Agreement in accordance with the terms contained in that agreement, which is attached hereto.

SECTION II

If any word, clause, phrase, section, or other portion of this ordinance shall be declared null, void, invalid, illegal, or unconstitutional, the remaining words, clauses, phrases, sections, and other portions of this ordinance shall remain in full force and effect, the provisions of this ordinance hereby being declared to be separable.

SECTION III

This ordinance shall become effective upon approval by the parish president or as otherwise provided in Section 2-13 (b) of the Home Rule Charter for a Consolidated Government for Terrebonne Parish, whichever occurs sooner.

Discussion began with several Council Members expressing their concerns regarding Administration acquiring the “power” of the Board of Adjustments, the verbiage used in the proposed ordinance and the raising of fees for residents versus the raising of fees for contractors and/or developers.

Planning and Zoning Director Chris Pulaski explained the reason(s) for the proposed ordinance as it related to the “non-conforming variance”, stating that some neighborhoods will be “grandfathered” in when the “proposed” ordinance is adopted. He stated that the powers of the Board of Adjustments will not be affected by the increased fee rate(s); but noted that the Planning and Zoning Commission is currently “losing” money with the current rate fee as it is.

Discussion ensued relative to the legal non-conforming variances portion(s) of the proposed ordinance, the transfer of powers from the Board of Adjustments to Administration, the potential for rate fee increases, multiple fees incurred when applying for multiple variances, the refunding of a variance fee if you are denied, and the verbiage used in the “proposed” ordinance; noting that the fees collected from the Planning and Zoning Commission will remain in their fund, but fees collected by the Houma Board of Adjustments is placed in the General Fund.

Parish Attorney Michelle Neil explained that “proposed” ordinance can be separated into two (2) ordinances, one detailing the fees and one detailing the variances; stating that any changes and/or “strikeouts” to the “proposed” ordinance, as it is presented, would have to done tonight before the public hearing on Wednesday, July 15th.

Mr. C. Hamner offered a *substitute motion* seconded by Mr. C. Harding, THAT the Community Development and Planning Committee amend the “proposed” ordinance striking

out the first portion of the ordinance relating to fees and vote on the second portion of the “proposed” ordinance transferring the power of the Board of Adjustments.

Mr. C. Hamner *withdrew his substitute motion*, and the second agreed, Mr. C. Harding, so that discussion could continue on the proposed changes to the aforementioned resolution.

Discussion further ensued regarding the proposing of two ordinances, one for the fee rate increase and one for the transferring of powers of the Board of Adjustments for clarification purposes.

If any word, clause, phrase, section, or other portion of this resolution shall be declared null, void, invalid, illegal, or unconstitutional, the remaining words, clauses, phrases, sections and other portions of this resolution shall remain in full force and effect, the provisions of this resolution hereby being declared to be severable.

This resolution shall become effective upon approval by the Parish President or as otherwise provided in Section 2-13(b) of the Home Rule Charter for a Consolidated Government for Terrebonne Parish, whichever occurs sooner.

Babin, "THAT, the Policy Procedure and Legal Committee introduce an ordinance to amend Terrebonne parish code of ordinances, section 16-118(d) to reduce the permit application fee for charitable games from \$200.00 to \$25.00 and to enact section 16-118(e) to direct all permit fees be deposited into the account of the sales and use tax department to defray the costs of issuing the permits, and to provide for related matters and call a public hearing on Wednesday, June 10, 2026, at 6:30 p.m."(*ORDIANANCE ADOPTED AFTER DISCUSSION)

Upon questioning from Ms. K. Chauvin, Parish Attorney Michelle Neil, and Chief Financial Officer, Kandace Mauldin explained where the funds from charitable games are distributed too - Sales and Use Tax and the TPCG Urban (City of Houma).

Ms. Neil also stated that the amount of money collected is not enough for the parish to process, so that is the reason for the reduction.

Mr. C. Hamner explained that he placed the item on the agenda to help the 501(c)3 local non-profit organizations that do raffles and other charitable events.

Mr. B. Pledger voiced his concerns and stated that he was against raising fees on permits for residents and lowering fees for non-profit organizations; stating that non-profit organizations who host bingo games several times a week benefit from profits made. He further stated that paying two hundred annually for a permit application, and being able to hold several games a week, is a profit for some non-profit organizations.

Discussion ensued regarding the increase of the permit application fees mid-year, the timing and adoption of the current proposed ordinance and how it would affect organizations that have already paid their permitting fee(s) for the current year.
