Perform mechanical repairs to maintain a minimum of twelve wastewater treatment plants. Interpret shop drawings and manufacturer specifications. Perform minor piping repairs.

PHYSICAL DEMANDS

- Lift over 50 lbs. (heavy)
- Routine bending, climbing of ladders and stairways, working from scaffolding, entering and working in enclosed areas, and valve turning

WORK ENVIRONMENT

Work indoors and outdoors with frequent exposure to wastewater, noise, heat, cold, and other hazardous conditions

EMERGENCY EVENTS

Required to work during emergency events.

ESSENTIAL FUNCTIONS

1. Work closely with superintendent on repairs to various parts and equipment to maintain 24-hour operation of a 16 MGD wastewater facility, including centrifugal pumps, sewage grinders, air and gas compressors, sludge collection equipment, sludge pumps, metering and aerators, etc.
2. Perform minor piping repairs.
3. Diagnose issues with mechanical equipment.
4. Disassemble mechanical equipment and change parts that need to be repaired or replaced.
5. Perform regularly scheduled maintenance on plant equipment, including greasing, changing oil, checking belts, cleaning check valves, etc.
6. Follow the division's preventative maintenance program (PMP).
7. Perform other duties as assigned by supervisor.

GENERAL REQUIREMENTS

1. Learn and practice applicable safety rules and regulations.
2. Ability to interpret shop drawings manufacturers specifications.
3. Possess good oral and written communication skills.
4. Possess and maintain personal phone for emergency call-out purposes.

EDUCATION, EXPERIENCE, AND LICENSES

1. High school diploma or GED certificate required.
2. Two to five years of experience working with various types of mechanical equipment (wastewater) preferred.
3. Experience with a preventative maintenance and work order system preferred.
4. Welding experience preferred.
5. Ability to possess and maintain a State Certification in Wastewater Collection IV.
6. Possess and maintain valid Louisiana driver's license.
