Requirements

- Documented tie to the storm event
- Must be in Terrebonne Parish
- National objective must be to benefit low-tomoderate income (LMI) persons
- 40% of allocation must be spent in a designated "Disadvantaged Community"
- Must meet one of the HUD Eligible Activities
 - Hometown Revitalization Program
 - Resilient Communities Infrastructure Program

Funds are not eligible for homeowner repairs, reconstruction or elevations.

Hometown Revitalization Program*

Purpose: To encourage new <u>economic revitalization</u> opportunities for LA communities while supporting the crucial recovery of the state's commercial areas.

- Create/retain jobs and to allow residents to have access to the products and services they need within their community.
- Respond to communities' most urgent rebuilding needs and assist in identifying long-term and innovative solutions to strengthen economic development within local communities.
- All funds must be used on projects that will benefit low to moderate income (LMI) areas/individuals and have a tie to the disaster and satisfy an unmet need.

*OCD defined two programs with different purposes. However, the allocation can be spent as the parish decides within the two programs.

Hometown Revitalization Program



Examples of eligible activities:

- Commercial revitalization grant
- Redeveloping an LMI commercial or industrial corridor
- Micro lending program
- Small business assistance program
- Business Incubators

Resilient Communities Infrastructure Program

Purpose: Aims to address remaining unmet needs by supporting more resilient community <u>infrastructure</u> and planning

- All funds must be used on projects that will benefit low to moderate income (LMI) areas/individuals and tie to the disaster.
- Serve disadvantage communities that were economically distressed prior to the storm events.

Resilient Communities Infrastructure Program



Examples of Eligible Activities

- Replace or redesign existing structures to mitigate against future disasters
- Relocating public buildings from a high-risk area through acquisition of new property
- Drainage improvements to reduce flooding
- Acquisition, construction, reconstruction, or installation of public works facilities
- Rehabilitate or replace existing pump systems
- Removal of material and architectural barriers which restrict mobility and accessibility

Timeline and Process

- Submission of the Recovery Proposal to LA State Office of Community Development: 3 months from OCD Allocation (CEA) approval – *January 8, 2024, for Allocation 1, February 19, 2024, for Allocation 2*
- Submission of Individual Project Applications to OCD 3 months from the Recovery Proposal approval
- Submission of Project-Specific Environmental Review 6 months from Project Application approval
- Submission of Final Project Plans, Specifications and Cost Estimates 6 months from Project Application approval
